Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the questionnaire on T3SC Newsletter and E-Bulletin. We really appreciate your comments. Here is a quick breakdown of the results and changes we have brought in as a result.

95% of respondents felt the communications help to increase their knowledge and increase awareness of local events and key issues affecting groups.

New V Award - For volunteers aged between 16-25

The new vinvolved Tameside Team is here, building on Millennium Volunteers, supporting and recognising Volunteering. If you have any volunteers that are between 16-25 that are helping out they can receive the new V award, to recognise and reward the positive impact they have made.

The award will be given after 50 hours volunteering. This can then be put on there CV's which should help you in to further education and employment. These awards are national so will add extra credentials for the young people. This is also good going for funding that you have a nationally recognised accreditation scheme being offered.



There's a simple registration form to fill in and then the young person gets a little booklet to fill in to keep the paperwork down to a minimum. The little booklet also comes with a paper file so good to use if you want and you then receive a flash new award sent out to you. There is also a chance to go to a celebration event which will be young people focused and all paid for. Otherwise you may want to have your own party. We can also publicise the good work the young people are doing so to get more publicity fro volunteering and your organisation.

If you think you have volunteers who would like to get the award, just for carrying on what they normally do, than please get in touch. We can send you the packs, come down and have a chat with you or the young people, which ever suits you best.

Children and Young People Summary Plan 2007 – 2010

Young people from Astley Sports College in Dukinfield were asked to review Tameside's Children's and Young People's Plan 2007 - 2010 and to make a child friendly version.



Jayne and Ruhel from NCH Participation Project went into Astley Sports College and consulted with a small group of children and young people in making a Children and Young People's Summary Plan 2007 -2010 child friendly booklet.



The group read the adult version and then gave their understandings of it and they learnt about what the Every Child Matters five Outcomes mean. They also had a photo shoot, designed to make the front cover and then they went on a reward trip to celebrate their achievement.

Did the children and young people enjoy it?

Yes! They had to work hard and it was challenging but they had lots of fun and felt proud that they took part in such a valuable piece of work that will help all children and young people to understand what is being done for them in Tameside so that they have better outcomes.

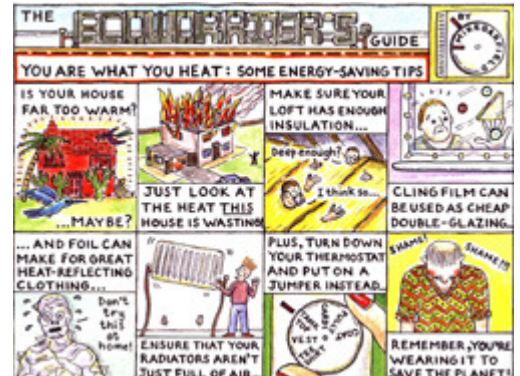

Free training in vision impairment awareness

Tameside Blind Association is offering free training in vision impairment awareness to volunteers who are interested in helping blind and partially sighted people. The next training day will be on **Tuesday 8 July from 10am - 3pm** (lunch included) at Tameside Blind Association offices on Wellington Parade, Dukinfield.

The organisation is particularly keen to hear from anyone who has their own transport and can escort people to appointments or social activities; volunteers who can do small odd jobs, anyone interested in assisting with leisure activities for the under 60's or helpers who can support people to use computers.

Youth Music Workshop

Youth Music is computer music production, live recording, song writing, MC/ rapping skills, DJ skills, sound design and mixdown techniques.



If you think there are young people in your area that would like to do this, then all you have to do is provide a venue and pay £175 - which is only 10%. (Makes the youth music pot go further). (youth music provide 90% of the cost). Youth music has heavily funded these taster workshops and we can offer the introductory series for £175.

The workshops will consist of five three hour sessions that will offer the young people aged up to 18, a chance to learn about DJ'ing, MC'ing, sound recording, sequencing, programming and composition using programs such a Cubase SX, Reason and Fruity Loops.

Upon completion of the programme, each student will receive a CD of the work that they have produced. The sessions will be delivered by two tutors and last for three hours each. Refreshments will be provided for the participants. There is a nominal booking charge of £175 for the five workshops (15 hrs total).

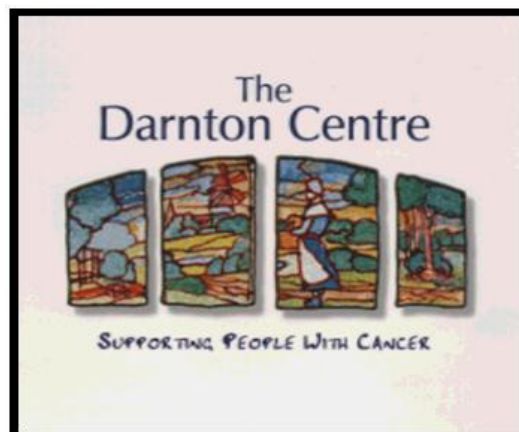

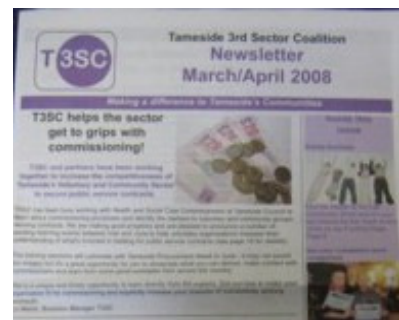

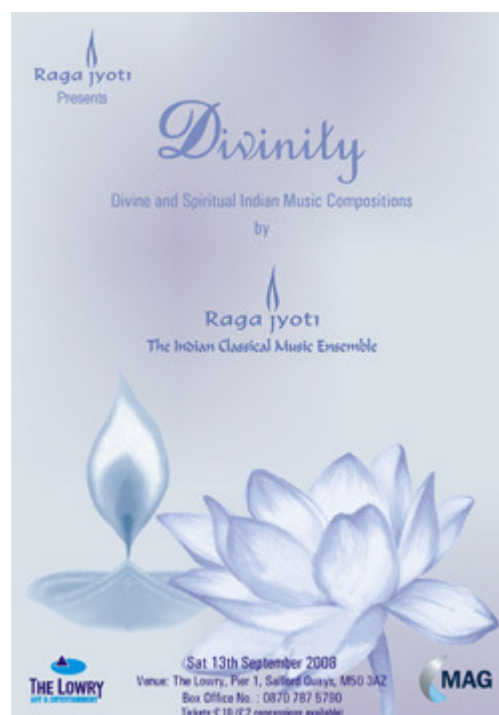
